- 5) Unless otherwise excused, a Troop Guide will:
 - a) Attend weekly troop and patrol meetings
 - b) Attend all troop campouts
 - c) Camp with the new Scout patrol
 - d) Attend Advancement Sessions
 - e) Attend PLC meetings
- 6) Completed an evaluation meeting with the Patrol ASM
